This sweater was born out of a craving for dip stitches. I first used them for one of the patterns in my sock book and wanted to play with them a bit more. Well, a lot more! With its mix and match options, you can place the pattern in different spots on the sweater to make it your own.

It's a good basic with a twist to add to your winter wardrobe, and its compound raglan will help you make it a staple of your handmade sweaters without compromising on fit.

Construction notes

This sweater is worked in the round, starting from the neck down. It starts with short row neck shaping and compound raglan shaping featuring an optional textured motif. The work is split at the underarm with the sleeves being put on hold while the body is worked. The sleeves are then picked up and worked in the round. Options to add the textured motif to the front of the neck, the end of the sleeves and the body are also provided.

Print instructions

Instructions are contained between pages 7 and 12. Details about the pattern are on pages 1 to 6. Photos and additional content are available on the last two pages.





Views and options included in the pattern



The following options are included in the pattern. You can mix and match them to construct your sweater:

- Folded or simple collar
- Short-row back neck shaping or not
- Textured motifs placements:
 - front neck triangle: follow the instructions highlighted in yellow with a plain border,
 - top of wrist triangle: follow the instructions highlighted in pink with a dotted border,
 - underarm panel: follow the instructions highlighted in green with a dashed border,
 - if you don't want one of these options (or none), follow the instructions without any highlighting.

The *red child sample* is worked with a simple collar, short-row back neck shaping, front neck textured triangle and underarm textured panel.

The *adult white sample* is worked with a folded collar, short-row back neck shaping, front neck and wrist textured triangles.

Sizes


A (B; C; D; E) [F; G; H; I] (J; K; L) to fit the bust with 2-5 cm / 3/4-2" of positive ease.

Finished bust measurements of 82.5 (90; 97.5; 105; 112.5) [120; 127.5; 135; 142.5] (150; 157.5; 165) cm / 32³/₈ (35³/₈; 38¹/₂; 41¹/₂; 44¹/₈) [46³/₄; 49⁷/₈; 53³/₈; 56] (58⁵/₈; 61¹/₈; 65¹/₈)"

To fit actual full bust measurements of: 77.5 (85; 92.5; 100; 107.5) [115; 122.5; 130; 137.5] (145; 152.5; 160) / 30¹/₂ (33¹/₂; 36³/₈; 39³/₈; 42³/₈) [45¹/₄; 48¹/₄; 51¹/₈; 54¹/₈] (57¹/₈; 60; 63)"

The white sample is worked in size E over a full bust of 106 cm / 4134" to get a little more ease (6.5 cm / 232" instead of 5 cm / 2") as I like to layer my sweaters in deep winter.

Yarn

This pattern is best worked with a thread that has good stitch definition, to bring out the motif.

Lenghts

900 (950; 1050; 1100; 1150) [1200; 1260; 1340; 1430] (1530; 1630; 1730) m / 984 (1039; 1148; 1203; 1258) [1312; 1378; 1465; 1564] (1673; 1783; 1892) yds of DK yarn.

Samples

All samples use Naturafil Merinos Extra (100% extrafine merino wool; 125 m / 136 yds per 50 g ball) in color:

- Ecru Merino (adult sample, white) ;
- Rouge Porto (child sample, red).

Gauge

Always measure samples after washing and complete drying. All measurements are measured in centimetres, then converted and rounded to the nearest eighth of an inch.

- 10 x 10 cm / 4 x 4"; knitted in the round on Needle A :
- Jersey = 18 stitches x 24 rounds.

Needles

Needle A (Main fabric)

4 mm/US #6, or the size needed to match the stocking stitch gauge in the following lengths:

- Circular needles at least 80 cm / 32" long
- Preferred style for knitting small diameters (or use only the 80 cm / 32"-long circular needles and the magic-loop technique).

Needle B (Ribbing)

3.5 mm / US #4, or one size down from Needle A, in the following lengths:

- 2 sets of circular needles at least 80 cm / 32" long (one set is only used for to close the folded brim of the collar)
- Preferred style for knitting small diameters (or use only the 80 cm / 32"-long circular needles and the magic-loop technique).

Notions

- 1 crochet hook in 3.5 mm / US #4 for the provisional cast-on
- 9/10 stitch markers: 1 for the beginning of rounds, 8 for the raglan increases, and 1 more if you want the optional front neck textured triangle.
- Waste yarn or your preferred stitch holder to put stitches on hold for the sleeves
- 1 tapestry needle

Abbreviations

CO: Cast on the specified number of stitches.
dec'd: Decreased
inc'd: Increased
M_{BOR}: Beginning of round marker
M_R: Raglan marker
M_I: Underarm textured side panel marker
M_I: Underarm textured triangle marker
M_I: Centered front neck textured triangle marker
PM: Place marker.
rnd(s): Round(s)[RW1]
RS: Right side.
sl1: slip 1 stitch purlwise[RW2]
SM: Slip marker.
st(s): Stitch(es).
WS: Wrong side.

k: Knit.

k2tog: Knit two stitches together. — 1st dec'd; right-leaning decrease.

RLI: Use the right needle to lift the right leg of the stitch on the row below, place it on the left needle, knit it through the back loop. — *1 st inc'd*; *left leaning increase*.

LLI: K1, use the left needle to lift the left leg of the stitch one row below of the one you knitted, knit it through the back loop. — *1 st inc'd; right leaning increase.* **p:** Purl.

ssk = Slip, slip, knit: Slip 2 stitches knitwise, one after the other, then knit slipped stitches together through the back loop. —1 st dec'd; left-leaning decrease.

No stitch: This stitch is ignored: it does not exist and is only added in the chart to help the stitches to line up and make the chart easier to follow (charts only).

1x1 Ribbing

To work 1x1 ribbing in the round, work every round as follows: **Rnd 1:** (k1, p1) to end. Repeat rnd 1 for pattern.

St st

To work in stocking stitch in the round, knit all stitches.
